We must defend what we have because.....



"First and biggest, the Governor wants to shift \$1.1 billion in Medicaid costs to New York City. It's not only unfair, it's just not grounded in the reality of how Medicaid works. Want to remind you, we have all raised sustained a one percent cut in Medicaid funding to our Health + Hospitals, that was announced in December. The Medicaid Redesign Team is potentially looking at up to \$2.5 billion in additional savings. And if it cannot find those savings, the Governor proposes to take that \$2.5 billion and cut it from localities around the state.". "This would literally set us back years. It's the largest public health system in the nation caring for more than a million New York City residents each year. It could not withstand cuts of this magnitude without reductions, profound reductions in services to people in need health care. And again, this would be true all over the State of New York. What would it mean for us if there was a \$1.1 billion cut? First in Health + Hospitals, we project it would mean the closing of 19 neighborhood clinics which treat 140,000 patients a year. It would result in the layoff of 1,300 doctors and nurses, frontline health care providers which would result in longer wait times for patients. And the specialty areas that would be affected would be treatment of cancer, heart disease, mental health, a number of other very, very serious needs
